



Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program (HVRP) Participant Training Desk Guide

HVRP grant recipients provide training targeted to the specific industries, occupations, and skills that are in demand locally. Training services can be provided in-house, through partners in the community, or the American Job Center (AJC).

HVRP Participant Training

Effective training equips HVRP participants with the skills needed to achieve their career goals. Some examples of job training that may be provided to participants are on-the-job training (OJT), apprenticeships, customized job training, upgrading and retraining, or other work-based learning, and occupational skills training provided by the applicant or a third-party training provider. Life skills, financial management, resumé writing, and interviewing preparation, and other job readiness or preparation services **are not considered** job-driven training. Employment and training programs must target in-demand occupations indicated in the Labor Market Information provided in the Statement of Need within the grant recipient's approved project narrative. Please note that placement into an unsubsidized apprenticeship is considered placement into employment.

Supportive Services and Training Differences

While supportive services can be critical for a veteran participating in HVRP, they **do not** meet the criteria for the HVRP training requirement. Supportive services are part of the case management process. Below are examples of supportive services that are not considered training by HVRP guidelines:

- Life Skills
- Resume Writing
- Job Search Skills
- Mock Interviewing
- Financial Literacy
- Time Management
- Soft Skills
- Stress Management

For participants who need assistance with topics that are considered supportive services, [Off-Base Transition Training \(OBTT\)](#) provides workshops for veterans related to employment. While OBTT workshops are not considered job-driven training, the information provided in these workshops enhances case management services to HVRP participants and can be counted as an employment service within the performance report.

Career-Path and Training-Path Matching

Sometimes, finding the right training path for HVRP participants takes out-of-the-box thinking! The resources below can be used to help your HVRP staff lead discussions with veteran participants to identify suitable, accessible, and valuable training opportunities that will equip them with the tools and knowledge necessary to reenter the workforce.

Accessibility is key when it comes to providing training support to HVRP participants. For many HVRP participants, especially those in rural localities, transportation can be a barrier to accessing training opportunities and stable employment. In the examples below, you will find web-based and virtual training options, in addition to training opportunities that can be provided on-site, to ensure all veterans have access to the training and support they need.

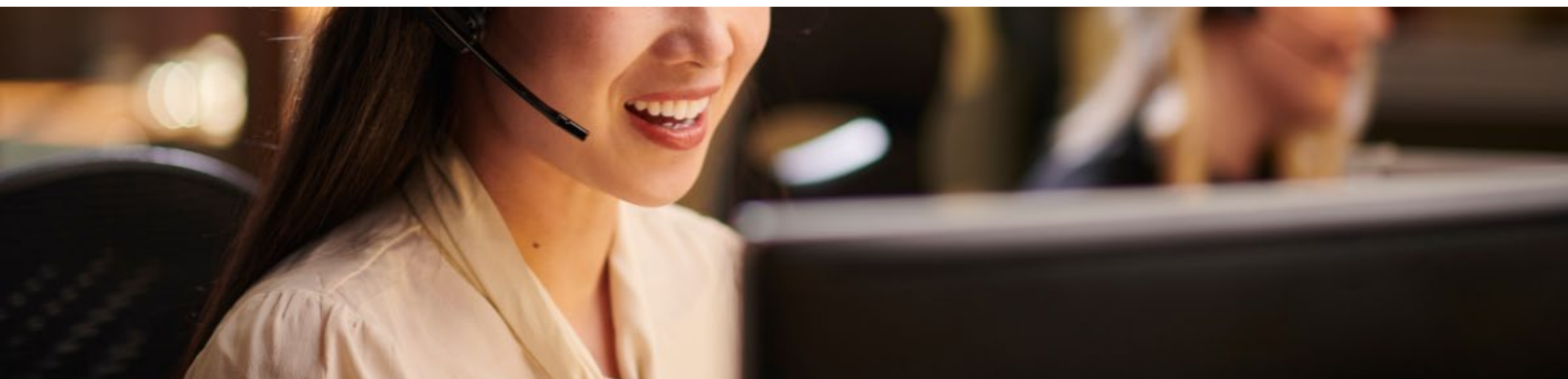


Computers and Information Technology (IT)

If the veteran is interested in computers and IT careers, consider the following training paths:

- Introductory programming language courses (i.e., Java, JavaScript, HyperText Markup Language [HTML], etc.)
- Project management training for veterans seeking managerial roles in IT

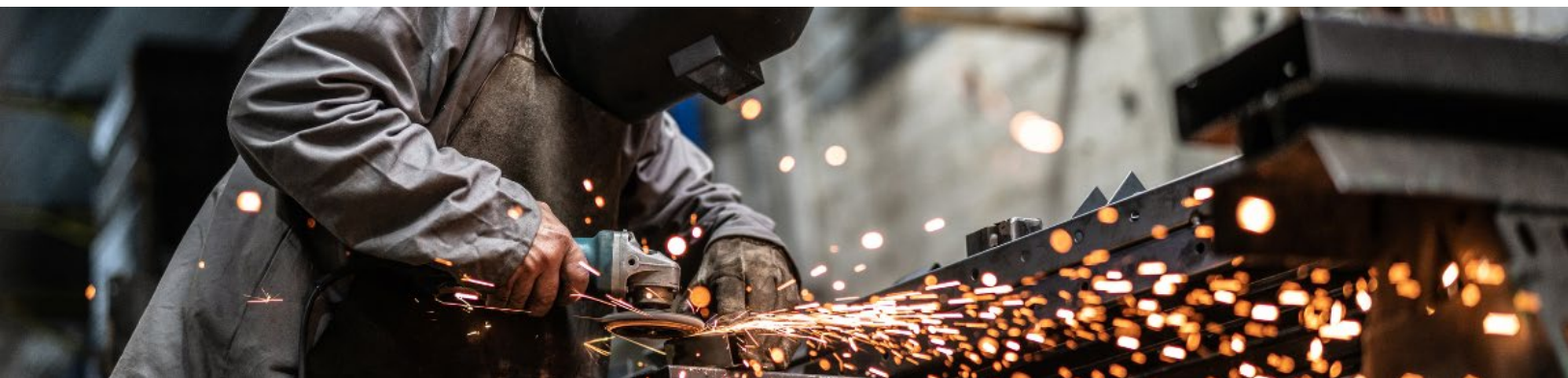

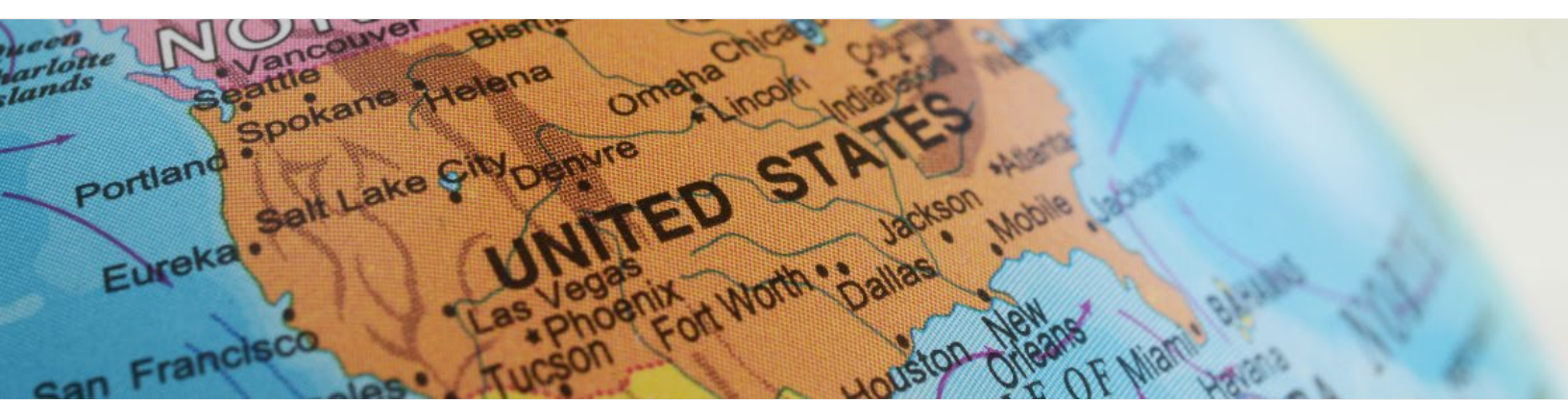


General Office Jobs and Miscellaneous
